

# COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

## CITY OF STACYVILLE

Mayor Paul Halbach called the regular May meeting of the Stacyville City Council to order at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, May 13, 2024, with council members Alex Emerson, Allyn Brumm, Roger Brumm, Jake Gerbig and Roger Hemann present. The Mayor then welcomed all guests and called for approval of the meeting agenda. Gerbig moved to accept the agenda seconded by Hemann and carried. Hemann moved and Emerson seconded to approve the minutes. All voted aye.

Shannon Adams reported to the council upcoming events she is working on. Garage sales May 30 – June 1; Summer Rec June 3 – June 28; Farmers Market starts May 21; Tuesdays on Broad will be June 4, July 2 and August 13. Adams has been getting good response with sponsors. Adams asked that she be paid with a W-2 instead of a 1099. Hemann moved and A. Brumm seconded to start paying Adams \$243.63 per month so that she would net \$250.00. All voted aye.

The City is still waiting for a bid from Klouse Concrete for the new shop. The City has received two other bids. The bids will be opened at the June meeting.

The council was given examples of adding paint on the road that other communities have used to slow down the traffic. The Sherriff's office was in town looking for speeding vehicles today. After some discussion, Hemann moved and Gerbig seconded to purchase two electronic speed machines. All voted aye.

Much discussion was had for the violators of junk, weeds and cars in Stacyville. The Clerk was instructed to send letters telling them they have to get their property cleaned up.

Public Works Director Joe Erbe said he has completed the city side of the water shut off valve inventory of type of water pipe used. It now comes down to identifying the pipe used on the resident's side. The city will start by using Web Site and then follow up with door hangers. The Inventory report is due to the DNR in October.

The City Attorney received another letter from James Player. No action was taken.

March Avenue is in need of upgrading with wider shoulders and replace asphalt with cement. This project will be shared with the county. The County has it in their long term plan for year 2026/2027.

Hemann moved and Gerbig second to approve the City audit for the year ending June 30, 2023 that Fort & Schlegel completed. All voted aye.

Neighbors of the property owned by Mark & Kim Adams complained to the council on the junk and rats that is on that property. Mayor Halbach will call the owner and have them hire an exterminator before they remove the junk and the Sheriff office will also be called.
